#### Unique Training Opportunity

Kentucky is a three-time recipient of the BJA Capital Case Litigation Initiative Grant. This has permitted Kentucky to develop further expertise in delivering capital defense education. Kentucky has also utilized the grant to incorporate training mental health professionals into its case review process. Kentucky has also sponsored many Train the Trainer events for public defender training directors from across the nation.

The National Alliance of Indigent Defense Educators is a section of the National Legal Aid and Defender Association. It has a long history of providing training, resources and support for public defender trainers.

The partnership of these two organizations for this education will create a training event for mental health experts and defense teams while at the same event providing training and support to training directors so they can implement similar training in their jurisdictions.

## Training Director Track

- **Sunday** will begin the week with training on facilitating small groups in the institute format in combination with a training for small group coaches in the institute
- **Monday** will focus on elements developing large Bring-Your-Own-Case capital institutes
  - Conducting needs assessments
  - Pre and post tests
  - Designing curriculum
  - Recruiting and developing faculty
- **Tuesday and Wednesday** these participants will participate in the Mental Health Experts portion of the institute
- **Thursday** participants will work to brainstorm, develop, and create action plans for their own training events

## Small Group Coaching Track

- **Sunday** will begin the week with training on facilitating small groups in the institute format in combination with a training for small group coaches in the institute
- **Monday thru Friday** participant will be assigned to work with experienced coaches to facilitate small groups in the Kentucky Death Penalty Institute using a bring your own case model
- **Facilitated Discussions** - throughout the week participants will meet at lunch to discuss the dynamics in the small groups, the death penalty institute plenary sessions and lessons they are learning from this experience
- **Faculty Meetings** - throughout the week participants will attend the faculty meetings for the death penalty institute
